

#### GW INSTITUTE FOR KOREAN STUDIES: VIRTUAL SUMMER STUDY ABROAD

"Zoom In and Out the Past, Present, and Future of Korea" - Monday, May 24, 2021 - Friday, June 4, 2021

The NEW Virtual Study Abroad Program 2021 in



Korea offers lectures and site visits recreated for online learning opportunities. Without traveling, students can get a taste of Korea and explore international perspectives. The border will be used as a lens into exploring four main themes: Korean identities, culture, division, and reunification. We will treat these themes not as mutually exclusive but constitutive entities. The participating students will trace the transnational processes of modernization, imperialism, colonization, the Cold War, decolonization, and neoliberalism that have shaped and continue to shape Korean identity and culture. Join our virtual guides as we tour both the history and a modern walkthrough of the palace. We will relive their fate and discuss how their home became one of the most famous tourist attractions in the world.

#### INCLUSIVE IRELAND SCHOLARSHIPS

Education in Ireland in collaboration with Diversity Abroad has announced the creation of a new scholarship program: the Inclusive Ireland Scholarships, which will support BIPOC students to study abroad in Ireland.

The applications for Fall 2021 are open now and will close on April 1 at 11:59pm PST. In order to be eligible, applicants must be BIPOC undergraduate students currently enrolled in a college or university in the US who have a minimum GPA of 3.0.

## THE WAY OF ST. JAMES: A EUROPEAN CULTURAL ITINERARY -GW MADRID COURSE

"In the year 1993, UNESCO included in its World Heritage List the Camino Francés and the Northern Routes to Santiago de Compostela. More than 1500 kilometers (932 miles) brimming with cultural heritage of historical importance, it was originally



designed and built to fill the needs of the many thousands of pilgrims in the medieval ages on their way to the town of Santiago de Compostela in the Northwest of the Iberian Peninsula. What remains intact today includes churches, hospitals, hostels, monasteries, bridges, roads, and even a few castles and other engineering structures, many of which testify to the artistic and architectural evolution that occurred during the medieval Kingdoms of the Iberian Peninsula, especially between the 11th – 16th Centuries."...[Read on with the link below]

Did you know, Queen's University Belfast (QUB) is a partner with OSA in **two** capacities?

Some of you may recognize QUB as the first cohort location for GW Global Bachelor's Program alongside the Shanghai/Fudan alternative. However, QUB is also one of GW's Exchange partners! Even if you're not a part of the GW Global Bachelor's Program, you could still spend a semester or year studying at Queen's!

As the leading UK university on the Island of Ireland, over 100 students from North America come to Queen's University Belfast each year to study abroad for a semester or an academic year



study abroad for a semester or an academic year. Study abroad students at Queen's are taught by world-leading researchers and experts in their field through lectures, tutorials or practical laboratories, in state-of-the-art facilities.

Very close to QUB campus, you can delve into the history of people in Northern Ireland at the <u>Ulster</u> <u>Museum</u> or take a calming stroll through the gorgeous Victorian <u>Botanic Gardens</u>. The Titanic Quarter, on the site where the infamous Titanic was designed, built and launched in 1912, is now an entertainment hub for Belfast. There you can explore the story of the doomed cruise ship at <u>Titanic</u> <u>Belfast</u>, take in a concert, or perhaps explore your own family's history at the <u>Public Record Office of N.</u> <u>Ireland</u>.

From the building of the Titanic to the present day, Belfast's story is a fascinating one, and on the current 'Must See' destination list. *Consider QUB as YOUR study abroad destination!*
